


The Classic Connection



The "Classics" lived up to their name, entering the hallowed halls of INTERNATIONAL QUARTET CHAMPIONS on July 2, 1983, at the Pittsburgh convention, where, incidentally, the Motor City Chorus competed, representing the Pioneer District. Their first award was Central States District Champs in 1975, and then, when three of the four relocated to Denver, they took the 1977 Rocky Mountain District championship. A number of bronze and silver medals were won on the way to the gold. They are: Curt Hutchinson, tenor, of Englewood, CO, a commercial insurance underwriter; Larry Wilson, lead, of Englewood, a public relations and marketing director; Terry Heltne, bass, a pharmaceutical sales rep from Aurora, CO; and George Davidson, baritone, an energy and safety manager from Englewood.
